






Historical Context

Historical Context

 WA Government allocated \$5 million for investigation and feasibility of the proposed PFSCUF.

Objectives of the PFSCUF

- Strengthening the State's regional economic base
- Attract industries and employment beyond the resources sector
- Capitalise on projects in North-West
- Community benefits from local participation flow-through
- Increased employment opportunities leading to more families settling in the region, supporting Pilbara Cities initiative
- Relieve pressure on road infrastructure

Lumsden Point, Port Hedland



- Vessel repairs, docking and maintenance
- Small scale fabrication and part replacement
- Support services and asset management
- Vessel mobilisation and de-mobilisation
- Load in/out, assembly and material staging

- 38 Hectares
- 3 year construction period
- Dredging and reclamation
- Works, building and site services
- Wharf structures
- Facility equipment
- Shiplift

- Wharf apron place to unload and load cargo (10.5 hectares)
- Berth place to moor vessels for loading and inwater repairs (500 metres)
- Ship repair yard place for out-water ship repair, including a 40m dual slipway, shiplift platform (7200 tonnes capacity), pipe spooling and roll-on roll-off ramp to provide amenity for heavy lift barges
- Adjacent facilities proposed PHPA General Cargo Wharf

- CUF Yard a dedicated space that can be leased by users on short or medium term.
 - Support infrastructure such as offices, fabrication hall, car parking, warehouses, workshops etc which also includes some dedicated space
- Fabrication and Services Estate dedicated space for longer term leases

Timeline

- Cabinet approval March 2012
- Four feasibility studies:
 - Market Demand Study GHD
 - Feasibility Engineering and Design Study GHD
 - Financial Viability Plan Macquarie Capital
 - Economic Diversification KPMG
- Business Case submitted to the Directors General of Commerce and Regional Development in December 2013
- Cabinet noted the progress and requested the two Ministers and Directors General to meet in early 2015
- Currently under review by the Government

Potential Employment

 The proposed Facility is likely to have an on-site workforce of 1,721 during the construction phase.

Likely to be 470 jobs during the operational phase.

Business Case

- Proposed PFSCUF will be transformational infrastructure.
- Creates a platform to facilitate new service businesses whilst supporting major industries in the Pilbara.
- Number of funding options.
- Industry sentiment positive due to potential increased opportunity to access industrial facilities in North-West region.
- Demand within each industry sector likely to change over time.
- Mix of projects, indicates that long term demand is likely to stay strong beyond 2030.
